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Migrants moving to a new country face the challenge of having to learn the host country language. There are numerous ways to achieve this ranging from language courses and self-study materials to language exchange partners and apps. However, finding the right option is not easy.

In response to this problem, partners in Germany, Ireland, Italy, Latvia and Sweden have been working together in the EU-funded project „L2 Paths“- Pathways to Host Country Languages for Migrants”. Over the past two years the project partners have:

- created a standardised format for language advice
- created a tool called Pathfinder for matching a person's needs with the learning options available
- trained language advisors and set up advice centers in all partner countries

Yana – a case study from Latvia

Yana Aksenova is a 24-year-old Russian girl. In November 2014 she moved to Riga (Latvia) after she got married. She now lives with her husband and his parents.

Yana started to learn Latvian at Baltic Bright in February 2015, not knowing a word of Latvian (A0 group). In September 2015 Yana decided to attend language advice sessions. She was interested in the Latvian language and wanted to find out more

about literacy support the language adviser could offer her. She wanted to improve her Latvian grammar and writing for study purposes.

During the advice sessions Yana was asked to make a list of different situations in which she wished to communicate using the Latvian language and the skills that she would need in these situations. The language advisor provided Yana with online materials appropriate for her level and informed her about the language learning tools available to enhance her independent learning.

In the end, Yana reached all her language learning goals and reached the A2 level. She is now studying at a college in Latvia.
